Vacuum clean-up is preferred. If sweeping is required use a dust suppressant. Use only non-sparking tools. Contact competent authorities after a spill.

7.1. Precautions for Safe Handling

Additional Hazards When Processed: Accumulation and dispersion of dust with an ignition source can cause a combustible dust explosion. Keep dust levels to a minimum and follow applicable regulations.

Precautions for Safe Handling: Wash hands and other exposed areas with mild soap and water before eating, drinking or smoking and when leaving work. Avoid breathing dust. Avoid contact with skin, eyes and clothing. Avoid creating or spreading dust. Keep away from heat, sparks, open flames, hot surfaces. – No smoking.

Hygiene Measures: Handle in accordance with good industrial hygiene and safety procedures.

Storage Conditions: Keep container closed when not in use. Prior to compounding, store FIRST®-Lansoprazole Compounding Kit at refrigerated temperature 2°C - 8°C (36°F - 46°F). Store the final compounded formulation at refrigerated temperature 2°C - 8°C (36°F - 46°F). Keep/Store away from direct sunlight, extremely high or low temperatures and incompatible materials.
